#### The Boat

A group of teenagers on a ministry trip in Jamaica were enjoying some free time playing with a frisbee. But when someone noticed that a boat had overturned off a nearby beach, the game ended and the teens eagerly rushed to the water to help.

They found a small group of professional boat operators struggling with their craft-trying to turn it upright. That's where the teens could help. They waded in, put their young strength to work and together they were able to right the boat.

What happened that day in the Caribbean reminds me of what can happen in the church. The "professionals", the Pastor and others who are trained to lead, face a task they can't do alone. It's often a struggle to get the work of the church done until lay people join in and work alongside the leadership.
