Mission Giving

We, as a church, give approximately 10% of our annual income to organisations or individuals involved in missionary activities. This year, 2010, we are giving around seven and half thousand pounds to home based organizations but also to organisations that work all around the world.

Locally we support the Christian Education Project who have two workers that go into almost every school in Redbridge, the London City Mission, Teen Challenge that has a branch in Ilford that provides a spiritual response to drug addiction and also Home Mission which supports ministers in churches who are unable to completely fund a pastor.

We also support the overseas work of the Leprosy Mission, Latin link, Living Waters working in Tanzania, Wycliffe Bible Translators (Paul and Joe Murrell who work in the

Central African Republic) and `Open Doors who help support Christians who live in countries which are not supportive of the Gospel.

We also support Daniel White who works with the needy in London, Ontario with the Salvation Army and Danny and Noelia Sonderegger who work with YWAM in Buenos Aires. Individuals in the fellowship can give to any of the above through the offering and the monies will be added to the church's gift and forwarded on.

CLACTON

Next Saturday we have a coach to take us to Clacton for a day out. The cost of the coach is £10 and we still have a few seats left. Each Sunday a team of people swing into action to ensure that our Sunday services run smoothly. Before most people arrive someone unlocks the premises and they are followed by the Welcome Team who greet you at the door with a cheery smile. They are on duty throughout the service in case anyone needs assistance. Whilst the service is running we have sound and projector operators who are responsible for what you see and hear. Once the service is finished you can join other members of the congregation over a cup of tea in the back hall. Again we have two people each week to make refreshments for you and occasionally a hot bacon roll.
